  - What is your reaction to being criticized?
  - Why is it difficult to show gentleness to others when we are being criticized or misunderstood?
- Can gentleness in someone be considered a trait of weakness? Why or why not?
  - o How does the world view the characteristic of gentleness?
  - What obstacles does the world have to combat gentleness?
- In what sense is God gentle, meek and humble? (Psalm 18:34-36)
- What portrait does the gentleness of God paint for us? (How does this help us to better understand the nature of God?) "The LORD, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness" (Exodus 34:6)
- How does Jesus emulate gentleness within his ministry? (Matthew 11:29-30)
  - o Does Jesus's gentleness make Him weak? Why?
  - o Why do we need the offer of Christ's gentleness in our life?
  - o How does Christ's gentleness bring about healing?
- What implication does gentleness have in our interactions with others?
  - o How can our gentleness bring about healing to others?
